# How to plan giving in your Will

Planning to leave a gift in your will is an important decision but it doesn't have to be complicated. There is information available to make the process as easy as possible. Here are basic steps involved:

## STEP 1: Make or update your Will

Your Will must be properly prepared and executed. If you decide to leave a gift to Disabled Children's Foundation in your will, make sure to include the correct wording.

## STEP 2: Select the way you Will gift

Leaving a gift in your Will is one of the most valuable and lasting ways you can support the Disabled Children's Foundation. There are a number of different ways you can remember us in your will. They include:



**Residual (percentage) gift.** You may leave a percentage of your your estate. Just 1, 2, 5% of your estate can make a difference.



**Pecuniary (fixed) gift.** This an exact sum of money that can be allocated to us.



**Specific gift.** You may leave a particular item of value such as property, art works, jewellery etc.

## STEP 3: State your intentions

It's important to communicate your final wishes with loved ones and executors. This will help to ensure that they are carried out.
